




A Field-Wide Approach

At The Leela Institute, we work to elevate and advance India's rich artistic and cultural heritage in the United States and globally. Our integrated approach aims to have a field-wide impact and includes three main components:

1. Our nationally and internationally performing dance company, the Leela Dance Collective, establishes Indian classical dance and music on the world stage by supporting the creation and performance of cutting-edge works of kathak dance.

2. Our educational institute, the Leela Academy along with its affiliate schools around the world, provides world-class education and pre-professional training in kathak dance and Hindustani classical music to dedicated and talented children and youth.

3. The Leela Endowment provides the financial infrastructure that is critical for the viability and sustainability of artistic traditions such as kathak dance and Hindustani classical music.





About the Leela Dance Collective

In 2016, five dancers - Rina Mehta, Rachna Nivas, Seibi Lee, Sarah Morelli, and Shefali Jain - met at a cabin in Lake Tahoe to commemorate the one-year anniversary of the passing of renowned kathak master and guru, Pandit Chitresh Das and to strategize for the future. That weekend the Leela Dance Collective was born with a mission to advance kathak and the rich artistic heritage of India. Leela was but an idea and an intention. Spurred by the dreams and passions of the five founders, it quickly became a working experiment and a way for Das' senior disciples to create a platform that nurtured the voices of established and emerging dancers and facilitate collaboration amongst artists. In the five years since its founding, the collective has created and toured three acclaimed artistic works, reaching audiences across the world and becoming a leader in the field of Indian classical dance.

From Calcutta to California and Back

Kathak master and guru, Pandit Chitresh Das was a pioneer in establishing kathak on American soil in the early 1970's. More than 40 years later, his disciples born and raised in the United States as the children of immigrants - are emerging as kathak choreographers, artists and lineage bearers. Together they have created and toured critically acclaimed productions that are preserving and advancing kathak dance on the world stage. In 2019, two of these productions traveled from America to make their India premieres. The premieres marked a watershed moment for the Leela Dance Collective, bringing the legacy of kathak dance full circle.


REACHING NEW AUDIENCES

Son of the Wind - Los Angeles Premiere



On September 14, 2019, after touring across the United States and India, we brought Son of the Wind to the iconic Ford Theatres in Hollywood for its Los Angeles premiere. Leela artists, students, staff, board and patrons rallied together like never before to bring India's epic, the Ramayana, to life, holding an audience of 1,000 in rapt attention under a full moon sky. The production garnered both audience and critical acclaim from the likes of the LA Times, Los Angeles Dance Chronicle, and National Public Radio, and provided a magical end to the 2019 season.



In Fall 2019, Leela joined the artist roster of the Music Center on Tour, a prestigious program designed to model artistic excellence, inspire creative thinking and introduce young K-12 audiences to diverse cultural traditions through performances in schools. Leela's arts education performance integrates lessons in South Asian geography and history, and even mathematics through kathak dance and Hindustani music, and reaches more than 5000 children in schools across Los Angeles county each year.

Support for Artists

The financial infrastructure for Indian classical art trails far behind that for classical art in the West. No place is this more evident than in the salaries available to ballet dancers and Western classical musicians as compared to the salaries available to Indian classical artists.*



At Leela we are committed to establishing the financial infrastructure necessary for India's artistic and cultural traditions to thrive and take their place on the world stage. This means providing crucial financial support to those artists that embody and advance these traditions through their work. As such we measure our annual pay per artist and are committed to increasing this number over time. We are proud to say that this number has grown consistently year-over-year, and we achieved a 20% increase from 2018 to 2019.

The Leela Academy is committed to helping passionate and talented individuals achieve their full potential as artists, leaders, and global citizens through world-class education in kathak. Guided by a belief in the universal value of kathak dance, the Academy offers pre-professional training for aspiring dancers, open and recreational classes for dance enthusiasts, and a knowledge-rich education for children and youth. The Academy's approach and curricula are grounded in the philosophy and pedagogy of renowned kathak master, Pandit Chitresh Das, articulated through a set of nine fundamental principles. These principles demonstrate the rich and profound spiritual and philosophical underpinnings of the Indian classical tradition and serve as a foundation for the Leela Academy's programs and work.



Summer Camp & Youth Summit

Each year, the Leela Academy partners with its sister schools, Chhandam and Sureela, to present a week-long summer camp and youth summit. This year's edition, held in the San Francisco Bay Area, gathered more than 30 children and teens from across the United States, providing them with the opportunity to study kathak dance and Hindustani classical music in an immersive learning environment; engage in insightful discussions on topics ranging from identity, immigration, gender, power, and more; and develop critical leadership skills through mentorship, peer-to-peer learning, and collaborative and direct action projects.

Through world-class training and mentorship in classical dance and music, we provide these young women with a nurturing environment that enables them to discover their own voices, connect to their cultural heritage, foster their creative abilities, and develop crucial leadership skills.

Kathak Open Source

This year, with support from the Sarva Mangal Trust, the Leela Academy embarked on a bold experiment that aspires to improve arts education, expand opportunity, connect educators and students, and facilitate the sharing of knowledge. The Kathak Open Source program aims to dramatically expand the reach of Leela's world class curriculum by providing a series of digital video and audio libraries in several languages featuring live classes, tutorials, musical tracks, and workbooks that guide and assist the learning and teaching process for students and educators worldwide.



A look at the infrastructure for classical dance and music in the West is instructive. Major cities across the United States boast acclaimed ballet companies, symphonies and operas, each supported by a large endowment and a strong community of donors. These endowments are a direct reflection of the value a community has placed on its artistic and cultural heritage. In stark contrast, while there are hundreds of Indian classical dance and music schools around the world, none of these are supported by a sustainable financial infrastructure. India's national dance and music institutes, although supported by financial trusts, provide meager support and pale in comparison to the need in the field. The Leela Endowment is the first and only self-standing endowment for Indian classical dance and music. To date, we have raised more than \$500,000 in seed funding to establish the endowment. Our aim is to raise \$5 million over the next two years and ultimately provide direct financial support to artists that are serving as tradition bearers and cultural ambassadors.





Expense by Program Area





Income by Program Area
