

The Leela Foundation provides the financial infrastructure that is critical for the viability and sustainability of India's artistic and cultural heritage.




About Leela Dance Collective





SPEAK goes Virtual

In April, the Page Theatre in Winona, MN presented a 10-day virtual residency, centered around LDC's kathak-tap collaboration, SPEAK. The residency featured 14 programs, from panel discussions and artist talks to workshops and performances, and reached more than 4500 people across the country.





Kathak: An American Story

In April 2020, Leela Dance Collective presented a 10-part livestream series, Kathak: An American Story, chronicling the journey of the critically-acclaimed Chitresh Das Dance Company. The company is credited for establishing kathak on the American mainstage over the course of 35 years with its innovative and groundbreaking productions. The livestream series paid homage to the legendary kathak master, Pt. Chitresh Das and all of the dancers and musicians that were a part of the company. Their artistry and work paved the way for kathak dance in America and Leela Dance Collective is honored to be carrying forward the company's legacy. Kathak: An American Story reached 8500 viewers across the globe.



About Leela Academy

The Leela Academy is committed to helping passionate and talented individuals achieve their full potential as artists, leaders, and global citizens through world-class education in kathak. The Academy's approach and curricula, grounded in the philosophy and pedagogy of Pt. Chitresh Das, provide access to Indian classical dance and music education, enrich the lives of individuals and families through arts, and preserve and pass on India's artistic heritage.



Leela Youth Dance Company

The Leela Youth Dance Company (LYDC) provides young South Asian women, ages 12-17, with a platform to become artists, cultural ambassadors, and leaders. LYDC members receive pre-professional training in kathak dance and have the opportunity to perform nationally at prestigious venues and festivals such as the WorldWideWomen's Girl's Festival, San Francisco Museum of Modern Art, Philadelphia Youth Festival, and many others. The program is unique in its approach, combining rigorous arts education, mentorship, and leadership training. In July 2020, LYDC held its first annual two-day Youth Conference, organized entirely by members of the LYDC with guidance from faculty. Titled "Who Are We?", the conference



featured kathak performances and lecture-demonstrations along with panels and round table discussions on South Asian identity, cultural bias, and the role of the arts in facilitating cross-cultural exchange. The conference is just one example of how the Leela Youth Dance Company is nurturing the voices of young South Asian women, empowering them to represent their communities and cultural heritage with vision and leadership.

Going Global

In March 2020, within 48 hours of the lockdown orders going into effect, Leela began offering free online kathak courses. The response was overwhelming. During the first two weeks alone, Leela teachers volunteered their time to teach more than 50 new students in the U.S, Canada, England, Mexico, Serbia, Costa Rica, and more. We also transitioned our ongoing classes to zoom, and were able to serve our long-term students without any interruption. As it became clear that the shift to virtual and online learning would continue over the long term, we began adapting both our curriculum and infrastructure to the new reality.

In September, Leela's affiliate schools in Los Angeles, San Francisco, Denver, and New York joined forces to launch our new Global Academy. This has enabled us to welcome students of all ages from anywhere and everywhere in the world. In 2020, our academy served over 260 students, offering nearly 30 virtual classes each week, as well as a variety of workshops, intensives, and special programs for students of all levels. As our student body continues to grow, we are proud to be building a truly global community of students, teachers, and dancers.




About Leela Foundation

The Leela Foundation is the first and only self-standing endowment for Indian classical dance and music, and is committed to establishing the financial infrastructure necessary for India's artistic and cultural traditions to thrive and take their place on the world stage. This means providing crucial financial support to those artists that embody and advance these traditions; supporting innovation and excellence in the field; and supporting cornerstone educational programs. To date, we have raised more than \$600,000 in seed funding to establish the endowment. Our aim is to raise \$2 million over the next two years and ultimately provide direct financial support to emerging and established artists and tradition bearers.

Patronage Matters

Indian classical arts are one of the richest cultural traditions in the world. They are also one of the most under-resourced. A look at the infrastructure for classical dance and music in the West is revealing. Every major city across the United States is home to a major ballet company, symphony, and opera. These institutions are supported by major endowments that ensure a viable future for art in America. These endowments, supported by individual patrons who firmly believe in the inherent value of classical art, reflect the value society places on these art forms. An equivalent infrastructure of arts organizations and endowments does not exist for Indian classical dance and music.




Patronage Matters

The financial infrastructure for Indian classical art trails far behind that for classical art in the West.

No place is this more evident than in the salaries available to ballet dancers and Western classical musicians as compared to the salaries available to Indian classical artists. At Leela we are committed to placing artists at the center of all we do. We operate with the understanding that artists should be provided for, cared for, and have space to grow their art. This means providing the financial support artists need to advance India's artistic traditions and cultural heritage with dignity, authenticity, and success.


Asset Allocation

Fixed Income - 32.4%






Expense by Program Area

- Fundraising 14.4%




Income by Program Area

- Fundraising 25.3%




Income by Type
